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The President of the Republic Meets with Members of the High Council of the National Scientific Community Abroad

The President of the Republic, Mr. Abdelmadjid Tebboune, met on Sunday with members of the High Council of the National Scientific Community Abroad.

Prof. Elias Zerhouni, the Council's coordinator, stated that during the meeting he had sensed "the President's conviction regarding the need for Algeria to make a real breakthrough today in various fields, drawing on its scientific community, both at home and abroad."



"We have the capabilities to do this, and our country is ready for this next step," said Mr. Zerhouni, emphasizing that the Council members listened attentively to "the constructive ideas put forward by the President of the Republic," while keeping him informed of the progress made so far toward "implementing operational projects and programs capable of advancing national development."

For his part, Prof. Belgacem Haba welcomed the creation of this Council by the President of the Republic, describing it as "a forum bringing together Algerian scientists based abroad with their counterparts within the country, with a view to strengthening ties between them and developing new programs to foster growth in various sectors."

In this vein, Professor Kamal Youcef-Toumi, a mechanical engineering specialist at Boston University, praised the President of the Republic's initiative to establish the High Council of the National Scientific Community Abroad, as part of an effort to "serve Algeria and strengthen its development process."

He further noted that, during his meeting with Council members, the President of the Republic had emphasized the need "to achieve

excellence and build scientific capacity capable of advancing the country.” These are objectives that “we will work to achieve in collaboration with experts, universities, and institutions within the country,” he stressed.

For his part, Professor Yahia Chebloune, a specialist in virology and vaccine development, expressed his gratitude to the President of the Republic for his initiative to create this Council, stating: “We engaged in a fruitful discussion with the President of the Republic, during which we sensed a strong commitment and determination to continue the country’s development in all areas, drawing on science and scholars.”

In this regard, he emphasized that the President of the Republic had called on the members of the Council to contribute to this effort by sharing their expertise, adding that “this meeting demonstrated the President of the Republic’s thorough understanding of Algeria’s current needs, particularly its scientific expertise in various fields.”

For his part, Mr. Abdelhamid Mellouk, a researcher in artificial intelligence and professor at the University of Paris, also praised the President’s keen interest in facilitating the transfer of expertise from Algerian scientists living abroad and in mentoring the young elite, who represent the next generation of leaders.

In this context, Dr. Bachir Taouli, a medical specialist and researcher in radiology in the United States of America, Professor Bachir Taouli, emphasized the importance of this meeting, expressing his gratitude to the President of the Republic for his constant support of Algerian scholars living abroad, wherever they may be, as well as for his commitment to strengthening their ties with their homeland by building bridges of communication and involving them in various vital fields.

Ms. Boufedecche Holds Talks with the Speaker of the Greek Parliament

The Speaker of the People's National Assembly, Ms. Khalida Boufedecche, held talks, on Saturday, with the Speaker of the Parliament of the Hellenic Republic, Mr. Nikitas Kaklamanis.

At the beginning of the talks, Ms. Boufedecche highlighted "the depth of the friendly and cooperative relations uniting Algeria and Greece," praising the level of momentum experienced by bilateral relations, particularly in light of "the positive outcomes resulting from the

political consultations between the two countries, as well as the results of the Joint Cooperation Council, which would form a basis for strengthening bilateral cooperation and broadening its horizons."



In this context, she emphasized the importance of continued work to "expand the areas of economic partnership between Algeria and Greece, allowing the exploitation of available capabilities in both countries and opening new horizons for economic operators, serving mutual interests."

She also reaffirmed the importance of strengthening cooperation in the Mediterranean space, given the historical and geographical ties uniting the peoples of the region, pointing to "the necessity of intensifying coordination and exchanging expertise on issues of mutual interest, contributing to supporting stability and development, and enhancing rapprochement among the countries and peoples of the Mediterranean."

Regarding parliamentary cooperation, Mrs. Boufedeché noted the importance of "elevating parliamentary diplomacy between Algeria and Greece, especially following the installation of the Algerian-Greek Parliamentary Friendship Group, as an institutional framework capable of enhancing regular communication between parliamentarians, exchanging experiences and expertise, and contributing to consolidating relations between the two legislative institutions."

For his part, the Speaker of the Greek Parliament emphasized the importance of continued strengthening of Algerian-Greek relations, particularly on the parliamentary level, highlighting the opportunities provided by parliamentary diplomacy to intensify dialogue and exchange views on various issues of mutual interest.

Furthermore, Mr. Kaklamanis stressed the need to work on “developing economic cooperation and expanding areas of partnership between the two countries, alongside enhancing coordination and cooperation in the Mediterranean space, in line with the depth of relations uniting Algeria and Greece.”

The two sides reviewed the state of multidimensional cooperation between Algeria and the European Union (EU) and exchanged views on ways to develop and strengthen it, in line with the priorities of both parties and their common interests, particularly in the areas of crisis management and response to natural disasters.

On this occasion, Ms. Lahbib presented the EU's experience in the field of humanitarian aid, particularly in Africa, and commended Algeria's role and traditional solidarity with neighbouring countries in the Sahel-Saharan region in the areas of humanitarian aid and development.

General Saïd Chanegriha Receives the Director of the General Department of Politics of the Vietnam People's Army



The Minister Delegate to the Minister of National Defence, Chief of Staff of People's National Army, General Saïd Chanegriha, received, Saturday, September 26, 2026, at the headquarters of the General Staff of the People's National Army, Secretary of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Vietnam and the Director of the General Department of Politics of the Vietnam People's Army, General Nguyễn Trọng Nghĩa.

The reception ceremony began with a salute to the national flag and the playing of the national anthems of both countries, as well as the rendering of military honors to General Nguyễn Trọng Nghĩa by formations from various branches of the People's National Army.

Subsequently, “General delivered a welcoming speech in which he began by extending a warm welcome to the Secretary of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Vietnam and his accompanying delegation, emphasizing that the shared history of struggle and human solidarity between the two countries has served as fertile ground for building a strong friendship and as a catalyst for enhancing cooperation and partnership.”

In this regard, he said: “I am pleased to welcome you and your accompanying delegation to the headquarters of the General Staff of the People’s National Army on the occasion of your visit to Algeria, which marks a new milestone in the process of strengthening our joint military cooperation and an important step toward elevating it to higher levels, in the interests of our two friendly countries.”

He continued, “Relations between Algeria and Vietnam are historic and deeply rooted in humanity; they were forged by shared suffering and national resistance against colonialism, deepened by revolutionary solidarity, and enriched by mutual respect, continuous political consultation, and tireless work toward building a strategic and exemplary partnership among the countries of the Global South.”

From the same perspective, he noted: “In this context, Vietnam was among the first countries to support the Algerian revolution, to host delegations from the National Liberation Front, and to share its expertise in armed struggle and revolutionary organization; it was also among the first countries to recognize the Provisional Government of the Algerian Republic.”

General Saïd Chanegriha emphasized that “the People’s National Army is ready to move forward in developing bilateral military cooperation, in a manner that serves the interests of both countries and enhances the prospects for progress and prosperity for the two friendly peoples.”

Hydrocarbons/OPEC

The Algiers Agreement is “a strategic turning point” for the global oil market



The Organization of Arab Petroleum Exporting Countries (OAPEC) stated that the Algiers Agreement, adopted by the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), marked “a strategic turning point” in the global oil market, as it laid the groundwork, in the long term, the essential foundations of the “OPEC+” agreement to address developments in the international oil market.

In the organization's monthly bulletin published Sunday to mark the 10th anniversary of the historic Algiers Agreement, its secretary-general, Khaled Al-Otaibi, stated that this agreement “was not merely a short-term response to falling prices, but represented a turning point in the approach to managing oil-related challenges,” laying the groundwork for a “more comprehensive and flexible” partnership among producing countries.

According to Mr. Al-Otaibi, this is evident in “the ability to withstand and address challenges, particularly those related to the drop in oil prices that occurred nearly ten years ago due to increased supply—especially U.S. shale oil—combined with weak demand growth and high inventory levels.”

He added that this situation has shown that rebalancing the oil market “cannot be achieved through unilateral actions, but requires large-scale cooperation among producers, based on dialogue, trust, and shared responsibility.”

Over the past ten years, the “OPEC+” alliance has demonstrated “its ability to weather successive periods of volatility and uncertainty, thanks to continuous monitoring of supply and demand trends, assessment of inventory and investment levels, and the adoption of measures tailored to market conditions,” the organization’s secretary-general emphasized.

Furthermore, the “OPEC+” experience has also proven, according to the same speaker, that cooperation among producers “is not intended to advance the interests of one party at the expense of another, but helps build a more balanced and predictable market, which supports the sustainability of investments, strengthens supply security, and protects the global economy from the negative repercussions of sudden fluctuations,” highlighting the role of the Algiers Agreement in laying the groundwork for coordinating collective action and adapting to changes in the global oil market.
